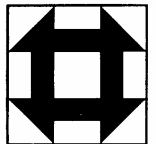

## March 2006 Minutes

Co-President, Marian Moore, called the meeting to order at 10 AM and introduced our speaker, Amanda Whitsel. Amanda talked about paper-piecing techniques and an easy way to do attic windows.

The minutes and treasurer's reports were accepted as printed in the newsletter. Myra Taylor, librarian, reported on a new book in the guild library - "Quilting with Carol Armstrong". She also asked us to please return any overdue library books.

Julie Monroe reminded us of our guild's tradition of making blocks for the outgoing presidents. Both Roxan and Linda have chosen 12" churn dash blocks. Roxan would like blue churn dashes on a cream background and would like for you to use your own fabric. Linda brought bright fabrics which we took pieces of. She would like the bright fabrics to be used for the churn dash with a background in your choice of black fabric.

Basting day will be March 20 and we have a large quilt to baste so need as many people as possible to come. Eliza Cagle reported that Charlotte Baker is recovering after having a new pacemaker put in, and Trixie Comfort has the flu. Eliza's husband is recovering after surgery. Eliza liked the surgeon's stitching so well, she wants to make him an honorary guild member! We hope everyone is well soon.

Co-President, Ginny Hendrix, suggested that we have a question and answer period at our meetings to help new quilters. She will pass out cards at the next meeting for us to put our questions on - or you can write them out ahead of time at home.

Jean Leslie said that in May we will have an Eagle Ranch quilts workday where we will put together kits from the fabric Sally Babcock of Quilted Hearts so generously gave us. Jean also recognized members who worked on the raffle quilt for the Braselton Library. Dee Moen donated the fabric for the quilt. Jean also reminded us of the opportunity we have to see the "Quilts of Gee's Bend" exhibit at the High Museum.

Martha Griffin reported on upcoming programs. In April, Annette Ornelas will tell us about "Peeled Back Patchwork". A workshop will follow the meeting. If you would like to register for the class, contact Martha for a supply list. Our May program will be by Lynnette Eden's on "Chain of Events". A workshop will follow in the afternoon.

Glenda Holcomb told us about the upcoming "Can of Worms" fabric swap. To participate bring 26 strips of green fabric measuring 2 1/2 inches by at least 19 inches. The fabric should be all the same, pre-washed and accurately cut. Bring them in an envelope with your name. Linda O'Donnell asked the 2007 raffle quilt committee to meet to plan how the quilt will be assembled. Linda also told us that her sister, Penny Little, has had a quilt accepted by the show in Paducah! Congratulations, Penny!

Hertha Hefner talked about plans for the Georgia Quilt Council Convention to be held on Saturday, March 18 at the Georgia Mountain Center in Gainesville. Anyone who is working at the convention should meet at the Georgia Mountain Center at 6 PM on Friday, March 17.

Hertha also discussed plans for our own Quilt Show to be held in October. She already has some door prizes and is dealing with the necessary forms.

Hospitality for the March meeting was provided by Charlotte Baker, Myra Taylor, Glenda Holcomb and Julie Monroe. Birthday raffle prizes were won by Pat Graham, Joan Cunningham and Donna Glisson. The door prize was won by Ginny Hendrix.

Nova Jackovitch reminded us that a quilting bee meets at her house on Wednesday afternoons. There is also a bee meeting at the Gainesville Civic Center at 7 PM on Tuesdays. Marian Moore suggested that we consider making lap quilts for nursing homes.

**CAN OF WORMS**

**Remember to bring 26, green, quilt shop quality cotton that has been washed and pressed,**

**2 ½ inch by 19 inches for our exchange. Have them in a zip lock bag with your name on it. Glenda Holcomb and Joan Cunningham are in charge of this and will divide them up during our meeting.**

**Directions for May;**

**Buy one yard of Red fabric. Then wash and press. Lay fabric out, Folded once, cut off both ends, then cut off the salvage and the folded edge. That will be length wise. Then all you have to do is cut 2”strips, yes 2” strips to the end which should yield 32 pieces of fabric that are 2” strips. Make sure that your strips are at least 19 inches long. Please nothing shorter than that. I had two 1 ½ inch strips left over. Don’t forget the fabric of your choice in red and all of one color and good quality quilting fabric. No Blends Please.**

Thank you one and all.

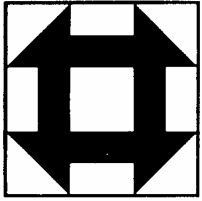

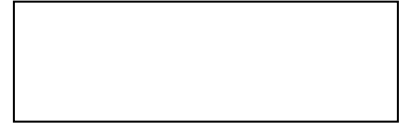

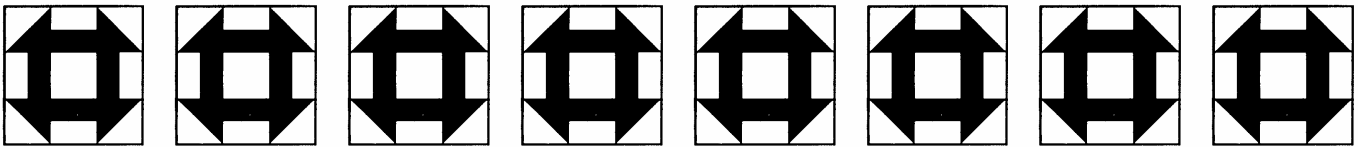
