## **QUILT TO BE BASTED???**

A benefit of being a member of the Hall County Quilt Guild is that your quilts can be basted for free by Guild members. The only requirement is that you participate in basting day, the third Monday of the month, and help baste at least two quilts. Non-members quilts can be basted for a fee: Twin \$25, Double \$35, Queen \$45, or King \$55. Please contact Vice-president Judy Wangemann two weeks in advance if you have a quilt to be basted.

As you know, we do not have a program for July. Shirley Erickson will be doing a sew-In. You really don't have to bring a sewing machine. It will be on her crayon method. You will need to bring a picture that your child or grandchild has drawn. You could bring a coloring book design. A box of 64 regular crayons, 2 to 4 - 16" squares of muslin and an extra piece of muslin to put on top when you are ironing. You will need a 14" or 16" square of background fabric; you can have more than one, but back with Freezer paper and mechanical pencil, patterns or coloring books. Maybe a small light box if you have one. Also, an iron. You can bring embroidery thread to work on the outline. This is optional.

If anyone has an idea for future programs, please see the program chairman.

Thanks, and look forward to seeing everyone at the picnic.

### SPRING CHICKEN FESTIVAL HALL COUNTY QUILT SHOW

The quilt show was a success because so many of our members volunteered to help make it work. More than 70 people came to see our quilts, many compliments were overheard. Some comments were concerning just which quilt to vote for in Viewer's Choice.

The winners of Viewer's Choice were 1st place, Judy Wangemann, Wake Up Gainesville, 2nd place Jean Leslie, Susan's Dresses, and Julie Monroe, Blue China Tea Cups. Congratulations to all of you on your beautiful work.

The folks at Hall County were more than hospitable to us; they not only invited us to show our quilts, they did not charge us for the space, and they set up and took down the poles and rods. They could not have been more friendly or helpful. And they have invited us to come back next year.

None of this would have ever happened if it weren't for Hertha Hefner, who took a leap of faith and organized our quilt show in October. She connected us with the Hall County folks, namely Kelly Brower and Richard Foote who loved our chicken quilts, and believed they fit in perfectly with the Festival.

This show was almost all profit for our Guild. Admissions netted \$222.00, \$27.00 on book sales, \$50.00 for two quilts that members sold and donated the proceeds to the Guild. The raffle quilt took in \$205.00 in ticket sales. Much of this profit, nearly \$500.00, will help pay for our lectures and workshops. It is events like this that enable the Guild to offer top-notch lectures and workshops for our members at a low cost.

FOR MAY 7, 2007**

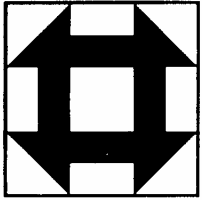
The meeting was called to order by Co-President Nancy Folsom at 10:00 AM. Linda O'Donnell introduced our quest speaker, Debby Kratovil who did an outstanding job explaining Tessellations – she began with the easiest quilt patterns and proceeded to more difficult patterns, including the Tessellated Star. She gave members an information sheet on Tessellations – Interlocking Designs. During her lecture she showed samples of this form of quilt with quilts she had made. Under Old Business Glenda Holcomb made the motion that Judy Wangemann's nomination to become the guilds new Program Chair Lady is accepted and it was seconded by Sylvia Hulsey. There were no additions or corrections to the minutes and the treasurer's report published in the newsletter was accepted. The meeting was adjourned at 11:00 for a celebration of Eliza Cagle's 80<sup>th</sup> birthday and a beautiful cake was enjoyed by all. Eliza was surprised and looked elegant in her sash, crown and specter. The meeting resumed at 11:15. The Committee reports were called for by Co-President Ginny Hendrix. Membership: Carol Nation reported that 36 members were present at the meeting and two ladies joined, Joan Briggs and Karen Shoda and a guest was Debbie DeLay. Myra Taylor, Library explained the Library procedure to new members. Sunshine: Eliza Cagle reported on Trixie Comforts car accident and we were all pleased she was at the meeting. Ginny thanked those that brought refreshments; everything was wonderful and the table was lovely too. Eagle Ranch: Jean Leslie read a thank you from Rebecca Castro and she reminded the group that there is still fabric available from Sally at Quilted Hearts for backings for Eagle Ranch quilts. Members are to call to request backing fabric to be brought to the meetings if needed. Richard Hood brought several Eagle Ranch quilts he quilted pro bono for pick up. Basting Day: there are no quilts to be basted and the suggestion was to have a Sewing Circle on that day. Ginny reported that the Executive Board had voted to offer a \$20.00 scholarship for classes – those interested in applying for same are to check with the Co-Presidents. If the scholarship is not used, it will be passed on to the next class offered. Glenda reported that the Sock Quilt has been cancelled due to lack of interest and will not be offered again this year and she gave out monthly pattern sheets for the Block of the Month to those participating. Linda reported that we did very well financially at the Quarter Mile of Quilts show on April 28 and we were invited to present our quilts at the event next year with a better location available. She presented adorable chicken pins for those that helped with the show. The Viewer's Choice winners at the show were: 1<sup>st</sup> place, Judy Wangemann, 2<sup>nd</sup>, Jean Leslie and 3<sup>rd</sup>, Julie Monroe. Linda also gave additional details on the Southern Picnic at Sunrise Cove June 4. At 9:30 there will be a Continental Breakfast and fried chicken will be purchased for lunch to go along with the dishes brought by members. Weather providing, a ride on the O' Donnell house boat will be enjoyed. Directions to Sunrise Cove will be emailed to members and possibly included in the Newsletter. Members were reminded to bring their placemats to the picnic as well as any left over scraps. Jean Leslie gave out the raffle quilt pictures and tickets for members to sell and set our goal at \$4,000. The member selling the most tickets will win a \$25 gift certificate. Jean will also check on our participation in the Art on the Square Show event at the Gainesville Square in late September. Show and Tell: 18 lovely quilt projects were shown. Our 2007 raffle quilt was displayed and it is breath taking! Door Prizes: There were 6 extra door prize winners and the main door prize was won by Diana Corilla. The meeting was adjourned at 12:10 PM.

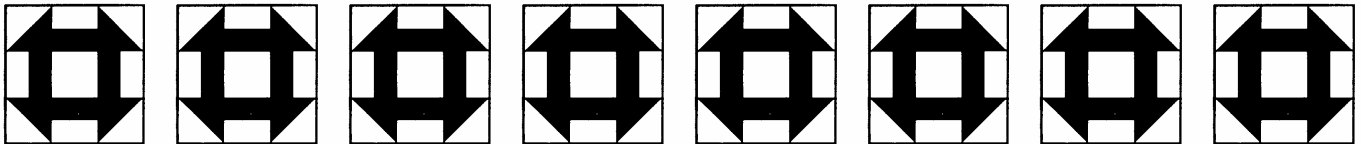
