SEWING MACHINE  
 90 TOPSTITCH NEEDLES AND 80 SHARP OF MICROTUX NEEDLES  
 ROTARY CUTTING EQUIPMENT  
 SCISSORS-SMALL SCISSORS ARE PREFERABLE-MANICURE SCISSORS ARE HELPFUL FOR SMALL MOTIFS  
 IRON ON STABILIZER  
 MUSLIN OR CANVAS FOR BASE  
 STARCH-LIQUID STARCH IS PREFERABLE- MIX WITH SMALL AMOUNT OF WATER IN A SPRAY BOTTLE (I FOUND IT AT A PUBLIX)  
 DESIGN BOARD THAT YOU WILL BE ABLE TO TRANSPORT YOUR DESIGN on FUSIBLE OF YOUR CHOICE OR FABRIC GLUES SUCH AS ROXANNES GLUE BASTE IT-

*Curves That Will Never Be Out of Shape  
 Supply List and Homework  
 Penny Little  
 Curvy Teacher*

Supply List**Basic sewing tools****Design Board****Sewing Machine****New rotary blade****Cutting mat the larger the better (may share)****6" x 24" ruler****Square rulers, 6 1/2"x 6 1/2", 12 1/2"x12 1/2" (useful but optional)**

Fabric, Ragamuffin Blocks (Orphan)

**4 to 6 - 1/2 yard pieces of fabric, 42"-44"****Ragamuffin blocks that coordinate (optional)****Motif fabric that you can't find a use for****Fabric that you like but can't remember why you bought it**

Fabric Suggestions

**Choose one main color family fabric with the remaining 1/2 yard pieces coordinating or as an accent. Solid or mottled fabric may be used. Fabrics with contrast, light, medium and dark will give your wall hanging sparkle and interest. Fabric with different scale will add texture and movement.**

A "Little" Background

**In 1994, I was at a crossroads in my life. Fate found me in a fabric store where I enrolled in a beginning quilting class. The class lasted one year, a block a month, making a sampler quilt. Over the years, my stash has grown, my ragamuffin blocks are stacked, and odds and ends clutter my stash room. I constructed a quilt to use these materials. It is so much fun to arrange the leftover blocks and create something artistic. The new created curvy blocks add movement and control of the completed quilt. The number of curvy blocks may determine the size of the quilt needed to decorate a space.**

### HALL COUNTY QUILT GUILD MINUTES FOR SEPTEMBER 10, 2007

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 by Co – President Nancy Folsom. The minutes and treasurer’s report were accepted as published in the newsletter. MEMBERSHIP, Carol Nation reported 21 members were signed in. BASTING DAY: there are 2 quilts to be basted on Monday September 17 and members having items for sale at the Art in the Square event were asked to bring those items to basting day. SUNSHINE: Eliza Cagle reported that Denny Long who visits her husband every day to feed him may lose her drivers license and Wilda Edmundson, a former member of the guild passed away recently. Eliza has been in touch with Holly Claus and she will have a letter from her to read soon regarding the rough time she is having with Rudolph. EAGLE RANCH: Jean Leslie reported many blocks and even completed quilts for Eagle Ranch have been turned in and the deadline to bring them to the guild meeting is October 1. A sign up sheet with shift hours was passed around for the Art in the Square event and all shifts were filled. Trixie Comfort has a PVC quilt hanger to hang our raffle quilt at the event. Jean Leslie and Nancy Folsom met during the break to set the rules for boutique items being sold at Art in the Square on September 29. All items must be labeled and prices posted on the items. Any items left after the event are to be donated for the Spring Quilt Show. Linda O’Donnell and Glenda Holcomb again went over up coming programs all of which sound wonderful. We were reminded that those wishing to participate in the fat quarter exchange are to place the fat quarter in a brown paper bag with the name INSIDE the bag. The bags will be exchanged and items will be made using the fat quarter and given to the owner at a future meeting. We were also reminded to sign up for the Christmas Luncheon table decoration challenge. There was a large discussion regarding rewarding our Long Arm Quilter’s who quilt our Eagle Ranch Quilts with a small payment to help cover the cost of thread used. We certainly cannot pay them enough for their time! Also it was decided that those quilters purchase batting as they are able to get it at sale prices. \$10 will be given to the Long Arm Quilters for every 2 quilts. HOSPITALITY: a sheet was passed around for members to sign up – more people are needed for October, November and January. Refreshments provided by Roxan Brown, Diana Carrillo, Ida Schwind, Jean Swinwood, and Joan Garland were enjoyed by the group as were the table decorations. Refreshments for the October meeting will be provided by Nancy Folsom, Torie Roney, Tina Pusbah, Diane Carrillo, and Fay Rawls. A 15 minute break began at 11:00 and the meeting resumed at 11:15. Julie Monroe announced several quilt related events coming up including the East Cobb Quilt Show, the Heart in Hand Quilt Show at the Bowen Art Center in Dawsonville and the Quilt Council Convention. She reminded members to bring blue and white fat quarters to put in the door prize basket for the convention on Oct. 1. There were many birthday door prizes as well as the main September door prize and again there were many happy winners. A lovely Show and Tell was presented by our talented quilters as well as some of the items made for the Art in the Square boutique. The meeting was adjourned at 11:50.

### EAGLE RANCH CHALLENGE UPDATE

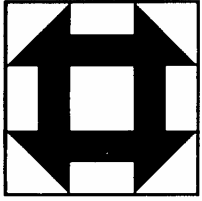
Per the instructions, the challenge is to make at least two squares using the fabric squares given to you, plus fabric of your own.

However, many of you are making 20 squares. If you will put the 20 squares together (4 rows with 5 squares in each row), and add borders, you will have made an ER quilt top. Then, you may put your name in the drawing 30 times.

Let's change the deadline to the November meeting. Please come to basting day, October 15th, to sew more squares. All you need to bring is your machine, sewing supplies and lunch. Pre-cut fabric squares will be provided. This will enable you to add your name to the drawing even more. No cutting, just sewing...what fun!

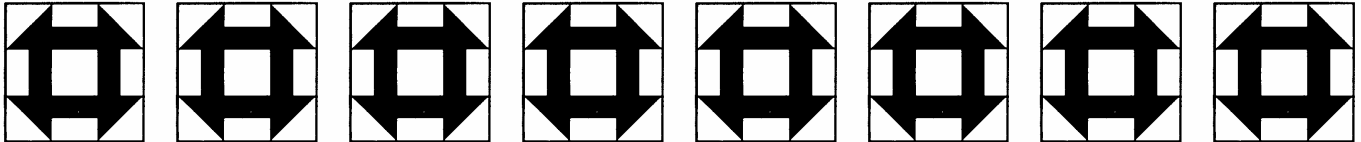
