EAGLE RANCH QUILTS

Thank you! Thank you! We have at least six new, beautiful, quilts for the children at ER. Our long arm quilters are so generous with their skill, time and talent. Glenda Holcomb has quilted 4 ER quilts since the August meeting; Judy Waggonman is quilting two for us. plus one of her own. And, Richard Hood has quilted more than we know!

Remember: 1. An ER quilt should be a queen size, but no larger than 60" X 70"
2. The back and batting must be at least 4" larger than the top on all four sides. This is a definite requirement for our generous long arm quilters.

In order to keep up with ER quilts, a new system will begin in September. There will be a receipt book for you to sign when you hand-in a quilt to be quilted. You will have a copy, a copy will be given to the long arm quilter for their record, and the guild will have a copy. Please pin your name on your quilt SO Jean Leslie can get it back to you for binding. Also, call Jean Leslie if you need fabric for the back, since we have fabric given to us last year by Quilted Hearts.

IRON ON STABILIZER

MUSLIN OR CANVAS FOR BASE

STARCH-LIQUID STARCH IS PREFERABLE- MIX WITH SMALL AMOUNT OF WATER IN A SPRAY BOTTLE (I FOUND IT AT A PUBLIX)

DESIGN BOARD THAT YOU WILL BE ABLE TO TRANSPORT YOUR DESIGN on

FUSIBLE OF YOUR CHOICE OR FABRIC GLUES SUCH AS ROXANNES GLUE BASTE IT-SPRAY ADHESIVE - HELPS TO HAVE BOTH FUSIBLE AND GLUE

FABRICS:

BACKGROUND FABRIC SETS THE TONE-GOOD CHOICES ARE BATIKS OR HAND PAINTED

There were no guests present at the meeting. It was suggested by Jean Leslie that Basting Day be called Basting Day Bee and members attending are to bring something to work on. SUNSHINE chair, Eliza Cagle reported that Denny Long's husband has Alzheimer's disease and at age 82 she visits him every day and feeds him. To put some sunshine in her life, we were asked to send her a card. Denny is a former member of the Guild. Jean Leslie EAGLE RANCH Chair reported that Jenny Thomas took 25 quilts to Eagle Ranch. Eagle Ranch has children/young adults from 1st grade to age 18. Jean gave out brown bags with cut fabric to make 12 inch no-matching-seams

Squares which will be put together for Eagle Ranch Quilts. For each square made the maker put their name in a drawing for a \$20 gift certificate. Deadline for bringing these squares is at the October meeting. Sew Memorable hung the raffle quilt and sold \$42.00 worth of tickets. The quilt was taken to the Athens Quilt Guild and possibly to an Athens Quilt Shop – if not able to be shown there it may be taken by Ginny Hendricks to the shop she works at. Richard Hood announced that Yahoo is closing their site for viewing our guild quilts and a new site with a new address will begin soon. Linda O'Donnell and Glenda Holcomb went through up coming programs starting with the Locker Hooking class in August to the February Sweat Shirt Jacket Class. They will have complete details regarding classes, materials needed etc. in the coming newsletters. There is going to be a fat quarter exchange in Sept. – the fat quarters are to be placed in a lunch bag with your name INSIDE the bag. They will be exchanged and something will be made with the fat quarter and returned to the owner of the fat quarter. **SPRING CHICKEN QUILT**

SHOW: Judy Wagemann will be chair person for the show and members are encouraged to participate by making any size quilt with a chicken theme. A vote was taken regarding participation on the Spring Chicken event and the motion was carried. Julie Monroe asked that members bring a blue and white fat quarter to put in a blue basket for the Quilt Council Convention to be held in October. She also showed the 2008 raffle quilt that has applique' in the center with piecing around it. Refreshments were provided by: Myra Taylor, Jean Leslie and Nancy Folsom. There will be a meeting of the Executive Board and Committee chairs at the October 1 meeting at 8:45. A 15 minute break began at 11:25 and the meeting resumed at 11:40. Several birthday door prizes and the main August door prize were drawn for and we had many happy winners! A reminder that we will be involved with the Art in the Square on September 29 and a sign up sheet will be passed around at the September meeting. We then enjoyed a lovely Show and Tell and the meeting was adjourned at 12 PM.

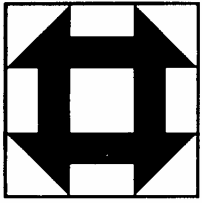
Please clear your calendar for September 29th. A sign-up sheet will be available at the September 10th guild meeting. On The Square will be under a big tent, with a table and chairs.

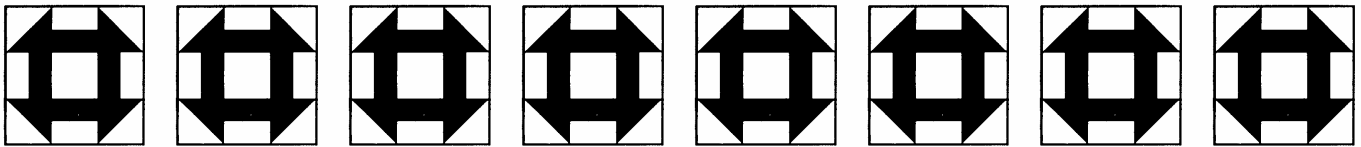
