March 3rd and 4th lecturer and workshop with Barbara Webster.

Barbara Webster's quilts have been winning awards ever since she made her first quilt. She has won major awards both nationally and internationally and has been featured in many publications and on many quilt industry and computer-related websites.

Barbara started as a traditional quilt maker but when her husband brought home a digital camera her quilt making took a right turn. After a lot of experimenting, she came to a printing method which yields accurate color, exquisite detail, and a soft fabric.

Barbara has been teaching for many years. Her students say she has the patience of Job. But much

Barbara says she just wants to be sure her students learn what they came to learn and have a good time doing it. Whether you want to learn to make a traditional quilt or quilts from your photos or paintings, Barbara can help you get there and have fun doing it. Supply: Basic sewing supply, 8 pictures on a CD, if you want additional pictures printed it will be \$7 per sheet, fabric for project.

Lost Quilt *Jean Leslie*

A quilt has been lost and we decided that we would make another to replace it. The quilt was a Red, White and Blue Rail Fence quilt belonging to Bonnie Roder. Directions are as followed: Cut 2 1/2 strips of Red, White and Blue fabric. Use whatever fabric you would like to. Sew together, always putting white fabric in the middle, using 1/4" seams. Press away from the white. Cut into a 6 1/2" block

and bring your blocks to the March meeting. Thank you for your help.

Oh! If we have any blocks leftover we will make Eagle Ranch Quilts.
